Penn Manor Athletes Return to Coach

In a recent presentation to the Penn Manor School Board, Athletic Director, Jeff Roth, noted that nearly 30 former PM student athletes were coaching in some capacity at Penn Manor in the 2016-17 school year.

Several of our alumni head coaches have built very successful programs in recent years. **Chris Telesco**, Class of 1998, guided the 2016 boys volleyball team to the State Championship game. His 2005 team won Section, League and District titles before bowing out in the State semi-final. Softball coach, **Dave Stokes**, Class of 1988, developed a team that won the Section, League, was District runner-up and advanced to the first round of States in 2017.

PM Baseball has produced a number of successful head coaches around the LL League. Long-time PM coach, Jim Zander, proudly points to former players who are now head coaches- **Tom Fish,** Class of 1997, Solanco; **Keith Martin,** Class of 2000, Lampeter Strasburg; **Jeremy Morrison,** Class of 2000, Hempfield - Assisting Jeremy at Hempfield are **Matt Rayha,** Class of 2008, and **Tanner Kennedy**, Class of 2011.



Alumni in the News

Penn Manor Alumni have been prominently featured in Lancaster Newspaper articles in recent months. We are sharing a few stories that represent four decades of graduates who are gaining recognition in a range of accomplishments.



Ken Hoak, Class of 1952: Although best known as an artist and art educator, Ken is also the curator for the Conestoga Area Historical Society. In a recent LNP feature article, "Athletes O'er the Ages," Hoak was interviewed about the current exhibit, "Play Ball: A Retrospective Exhibit of Over 100 Years of Athletic Activities in the Penn Manor Area." The show is open to the public, 1-4 PM, Saturdays and Sundays through December 10 at the 51 Kendig Road, Conestoga facility. Also quoted in the article was Bob Lehr, Class of 1953, who assisted with the exhibit.

P. Robert "Bob" Herr, Class of 1951: Bob recently stepped down after two decades of service as an LNP Baseball Tournament commissioner. The article highlighted Bob's 70 years in baseball, including playing high school ball at Penn Manor and college ball at Millersville. He went on to coach 13 seasons at McCaskey where he also served as a social studies teacher and department chair.



Alberto Flores, Class of 1987: Alberto's new business, Bert's Bottle Shop, was featured in several recent articles. After a career in information technology, Alberto opened the craft beer shop in March on Comet Drive in Millersville Commons. The shop features a 400-beer inventory but also carries wine – two reds and two whites – on a tap system. A few cocktails based on draft ginger beer and a small food menu are also available.

Anthony Reynolds and Holly (Texter) Reynolds, Class of 2000: Featured in an LNP real estate article, "Company Breathes New Life Into City Row Home," Anthony and Holly are part of the Renew Homes team. Renew Homes buys and flips homes based on "structural and design transformations." "Holly dreams it up and Anthony builds it."

Garrett Book, Class of 2005: Garrett and his landscaping partner in Earthbound Artisan were featured in a business article highlighting their organic approach to lawn care. Their landscape management program uses only organic and synthetic chemical-free products. Their goal is to be a "more ecologically and socially conscious business . . . that equally values people, planet and profit."

Matt Johnson, Class of 2000: When Nobel laureate, Malala Yousafzai visited Lancaster in April, her visit was prompted by a message sent to her foundation's website by MU adjunct professor, Matt Johnson. Matt asked if she would visit Lancaster to "galvanize our already huge stand behind refugees." Accepting Matt's invitation, Malala stated, "This place is a clear example to the world of what it means to live together, what is this idea of community."

Emily Landis and Dan Ramirez, Class of 1998, Janeen Maxwell, Class of 2001: An LNP article, "Slaying Litter," describes the artistic Trash Dragon created for volunteers to use to clean up trash around Lancaster city. Janeen applied for and received a Keep Pennsylvania Beautiful grant to pay for the bike, two shopping carts and supplies. Emily, as Executive Director of the Lancaster Science Factory, sponsored the build session for the Dragon which is loaned out to groups for the day for clean-up projects in the city. Dan was one of the volunteers featured in a photo showing the Trash Dragon in action.
