### **Athletic Wall of Honor Inductees Honored**

The 2012 Induction Class to the Penn Manor Athletic Wall of Honor was honored on Friday, January 4, 2013 in the high school library. The following inductees were then introduced during halftime of the varsity basketball game that same night:

Lloyd Byers (Class of 1964) - Lloyd was a three-sport athlete excelling in soccer, wrestling, and baseball.

Kambria Riggins (Class of 2002) - Kambria broke the all-time career scoring record for L-L League girls soccer and was a key player for Penn Manor's State Championship team. She went on to West Virginia University on a full-

ride scholarship and excelled there.

Donna Bervinchak (Class of 1985) - Donna had an exceptional career in gymnastics which culminated in her winning a State Championship in the parallel bars. After graduation she continued her gymnastics career at Northeastern University.

Amy Martin (Class of 1982) - Amy was a 4-time L-L League track and field champion and continued her track and field career at Rutgers University.

Guenter Miller (Class of 1992) - Guenter qualified for State

competition all four years he was on Penn Manor's swim team. He went on to Bowling Green University where he became the Mid-American Conference champion in the 200 yard butterfly for three years during his college career.





**Matt Volmer, Class of 2007:** Matt showed great promise while at Penn Manor concentrating much of his scholastic effort in the areas of drawing/commercial arts and technology. Following his graduation from the Art Institute of York Pennsylvania he did some extraordinary web site design work with Hershey Entertainment and now continues his career with Stoner Bunting Advertising.

**Dr. Jake Bleacher, Class of 1996:** Jake continues his impressive career as a NASA scientist. After graduating from Franklin and Marshall, he earned his doctorate in geological sciences from Arizona State University. This year he addressed the Library of Congress explaining the most recent work of NASA's Desert Research and Technology (RATS) team in northern Arizona where the terrain provides the rough, dusty environment ideal for testing robotics and extravehicular equipment utilized for solar system exploration. Don McCann, Class of 1963: After retiring from a successful career in banking, Don started volunteering in the mission of restoring the American chestnut tree and has personally planted acreage in Potter County from hybrid species. Recognizing his commitment and expertise the Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Chestnut Foundation has elected Don President of its board of directors.

Alex Kuhl, Class of 2012: At the age of twelve Alex decided that one of his ambitions in life would be to compete as a bull rider in rodeo competition. This past July he traveled to Rock Springs, Wyoming to realize his dream by entering national competition which he had qualified for through success in regional events. He qualified for two events, bronco riding and bull riding. Although he suffered a concussion from a blow from a bull's horn, he loved the experience and has not completely ruled out returning to more rodeo competition in future years.

**Krista (Greider) Cox, Class of 1990** - Krista graduated in 1990 with an appreciation for the opportunities she enjoyed at Penn Manor. The daughter of Anne and Ken (former PM School Board member) Greider, Krista was the baby of six children – Cynthia, Karen, Ken, Melissa and Joan. She grew up on a farm and went through a boots and flannel phase in high school. She served as goalie on the state semi-finalist field hockey team, participated in theater, NHS and was elected Class secretary.

Because she was inspired by Liz Loht at Letort, her goal was always to be a third grade teacher. Initially, Krista struggled in the elementary education program at Millersville. She withdrew and worked third shift at a gas station, returning to college in the spring semester.



Krista started substitute teaching in Penn Manor in 1994, but left in January of 1999 for a permanent 7th grade language arts position in Ephrata. There she became a 7-12 Supervisor, K-12 Curriculum Coordinator, and Ephrata Middle School Assistant Principal before returning to Penn Manor on 2009 as an Assistant High School Principal.

Why return to Penn Manor? Krista has never actually left the district. She's lived here all of her life. Returning to Penn Manor to work enables Krista to be a parent and do her job. Now she doesn't miss her kids' school activities and enjoys the support of her mom with childcare. Krista and husband, Matt, believe that Penn Manor has been a good place for their kids - Rob, Madison, AJ and Olivia - to grow up.

Was it difficult for her former high school teachers to accept her as a leader? Krista feels the biggest challenge was that this was her first high school experience. She worked to build relationships with students and staff while learning her job. During the 2012-2013 school year, Krista seems to have successfully transitioned to the elementary level where she now serves as Eshleman's Principal. She feels that her unflappable personality is well suited for kids of all ages. "It doesn't take much to change someone's day – take time to smile and listen to them."



Harry Frey, Class of 1958 - The Class of 1958 was the last class that graduated from the "old high school." Harry Frey remembers classes held in the church and the fire hall along with the small, cinder block gym. They played basketball in Brooks Hall at Millersville.

Although he didn't have a favorite subject, Harry remembered his teachers fondly - Miss Aston, "Bugs" Johnson, and for Latin, Stan Charles. He remembers Stan telling students, "Don't get frustrated. I'm just like Moses, I'll lead you through the wilderness." Harry greeted Stan with a "Hi Moses!" in the hallway. "That's Mr. Moses to you!" Stan replied.

Harry attended West Chester State Teachers College as a Physical Education major, while farming and working road construction in the summers. He got his

first teaching job in 1962, teaching grade 8 PE at Penn Manor. Harry became assistant boys' basket-ball and soccer coach with Dave Neff as the head coach in 1963, eventually becoming head coach in each sport. His longest coaching stint was as the JV baseball coach with Dale Bennetch. He also coached girls' basketball 1980-85.

Harry considers his greatest success as a coach to be the 1971 and 1972 boys' basketball teams with Wally Walker. Both teams made it to states and had large followings with spectator busses. In talking about students he's coached and taught, Harry noted, "You like seeing how successful your kids have become."

Harry and wife, Faye, have two children, Beau and Val, who is married to Nelson Breneman. Grandson, Aron, just graduated from Delaware Valley and is now in charge of calves and heifers on the family farm. Granddaughter, Katie, is a sophomore at Penn State where she plays field hockey for PM grad and former basketball player on Harry's team, Coach Lisa Bervinchak-Love.

What does Harry do in retirement, in addition to traveling to watch Katie play field hockey? "The greatest part is no longer wearing a wrist watch after 41 years of memorizing the bell schedule at the high school." Harry still gets up at 6:00 AM, but now enjoys being able to do things during the day in the "real world." In September and October, 2011, Harry took a 3 week trip that included visiting Wally's family in Seattle and a trip to Maui. He makes spring and fall deer and turkey hunting trips and enjoys being able to stay for 3 or 4 days. He's playing a little more golf, enjoying an annual spring trip with friends to Pinehurst.



**C. Willis Herr** is a 1960 graduate of Penn Manor and attended Penn State University. In high school, Willis was a member of the Sports Club, Dance Club and Shakespearean Club. From 1964 to 2009 he served as C.E.O of Herr's Fruit Farm. Willis was a member of the Penn Manor School Board from 1997 to 2009 serving as board president for 10 years. He is a former president of the Marietta Jaycees, former president of Hopeway, an agency that supports the transition of inmates back into the mainstream, former president of the Board of the Directors of the Lancaster Association of Retarded Citizens and an active member and board



member of the Manor Brethren in Christ Church. Willis received the "Service to Mankind" award from the Sertoma Club of Lancaster. Willis is married to Martha Finney (PM '60) and has seven children and eight grandchildren who all attend(ed) Penn Manor schools.



**Boyd N. Lyon** was a 1988 graduate of Penn Manor where he was a member of the Soccer Team and Key Club. Boyd earned a B.S degree in Biology from San Diego State University and was also a member of the soccer team. After coaching soccer for several years, Boyd

decided to pursue a career focused on his love of turtles. His area of interest was the collection of data on the elusive male sea turtles. Boyd moved to Florida to attend the University of Central Florida to pursue a master's degree in Biology and do research at the UCF Marine Turtle Research Institute. In his effort to research and protect the male sea turtles, he implemented a hand capturing method for tagging and studying turtles without using



nets. During a research trip in August 2006, Boyd attempted to tag a turtle spotted in the ocean. Something went wrong and Boyd did not surface from his dive. Several memorials have been established in Boyd's name. The University of Central Florida offers the UCF Boyd Lyon Memorial Fellowship for a doctoral student in the Conservation Biology Ph.D. program. There is also the Boyd Lyon Sea Turtle Fund that provides an annual scholarship to a marine biology student whose research is focused on sea turtles.



**Richard M. Stoner** is a 2001 graduate of Penn Manor High School. Rich participated in Soccer and Track. He earned his B.S. and his Ph.D. in Bioengineering from the University of Pittsburgh. He was a postdoctoral fellow in Neurosciences at the University of California San Diego Center for Autism Research. Rich developed programs to allow visualization of large

amounts of data. His goal was to develop tools that use modern technology such as an iPad or iPhone to access scientific information. In 2012, he was awarded the \$25,000 grand prize at an international competition for creating a remote diagnostic for autism app.

The app will help in the screening and diagnosis of autism in children. Rich is currently employed by the University of California San Diego medical school. He is busy developing WholeSlide Inc., a software company dealing in mobile app development across numerous scientific fields. Rich also works with Health Labs, Calit2 designing and building low cost hardware for use in third world hospitals.





**Mark J. Swayne** is a 1984 graduate of Penn Manor High School. While at Penn Manor, Mark participated in Key Club and Football. He graduated from Norwich Military University in 1988 earning a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering. He attended Naval Flight School receiving his wings and was

named a Naval flight officer. Mark served as a navigator on the A6 bomber and received the Navy Achievement medal. He also earned the Defense Superior Service Medal. In 1993, Mark led a bombing raid into Iraq. He served as a Legislative Fellow to Senator John Warner (VA) and in 2005 was named Director for African Affairs for the National Security Council. He retired from the Navy as a Commander in 2008 after serving 20 years. Mark worked at the Pentagon with the Joint Chiefs of Staff as a civilian contractor focusing on Somalia. He is cur-



rently employed by the Office of the Secretary of Defense - Africa Policy.
