## History of the High School

In September 1958, Penn Manor Junior and Senior High School opened its doors on this site. Over the past two years, the \$30 million dollar renovation project joined the former ninth grade building and the old high school building. The new construction took place over the former parking tiers and resulted in a new gymnasium, cafeteria, library media center and enclosed walkway. Both buildings have been completely renovated resulting in updated classrooms and lab facilities to better meet the needs of our students as we move into the next century.



In renovating the high school, much of the old tile was retained in the familiar curving hallways. New terrazzo floors and ceiling tile along with freshly painted lockers brighten the halls.



Penn Manor High School boasts over 500 computers all connected to the Internet. Fifty of these computers are housed in the new library media center.
