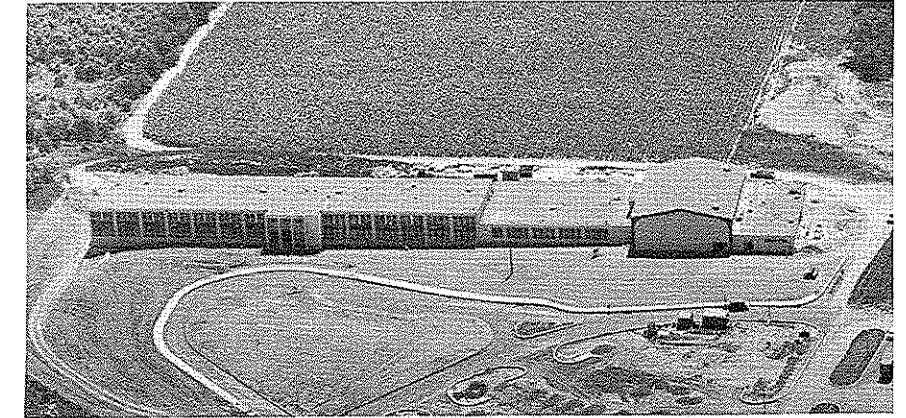

PENN MANOR JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

This new Junior High School building is located on an eight acre plot adjoining the site of the Senior High School building in Millersville Borough.

These beautiful new buildings were made possible by the joint efforts of the five school boards comprising the Penn Manor Jointure -- Conestoga Township, Manor Union, Martic Township, Millersville Borough, and Pequea Township -- and the Manor Joint High School Authority, the organization responsible for financing the projects and composed of representatives from the five school districts.

Applications for this project were filed early in 1959, and on July 27, 1959 this project was approved by the Bureau of School Buildings, Department of Public Instruction. A contract for designing the building was negotiated with Coleman & Coleman Architects, and construction contracts were awarded in September 1961. Final inspection was conducted on October 10, 1962.

The Junior High School building has a rated capacity of about 550 students, with a present enrollment of about 500 comprised of 314 seventh grade students and 183 eighth grade students. The remaining students in the eighth grade and grades nine, ten, eleven and twelve are enrolled in the Senior High School building. Eventually half of grades seven, eight and nine will be enrolled in this building, and the other half will be enrolled in another Junior High School building at a different location.

On November 4, 1962 the Penn Manor Joint High School Board and the Manor Joint High School Authority are able to present this beautiful new Penn Manor Junior High School.
