How to send your SAT/ACT Scores...

SAT/ACT Scores are not listed on official transcripts sent by Penn Manor. Students are responsible for sending their scores to prospective colleges.

- Log into the account you used to sign up for the SAT/ACT or by listing the colleges when you register for the test.
- For SATs, The first four colleges are free and you can add/drop schools up to nine days after you take the SAT. There is a fee to send it to more colleges.
- The SAT Program recommends that students send all of their scores if they are unsure of which scores to send.

Tips for job seekers:

- Make sure your resume is free from errors, is easy to read, and highlights your skills. Your resume is your first step to an interview.
- Dress professionally for an interview. Look up common interview questions and prepare some answers. Be sure to research the company before the interview.
- Search for jobs on public job boards online. If there is a particular company you want to work for, the best place to look for job postings is directly on the company website.

- In the future, you may need Certifications and degrees to be promoted in a job. Start by taking a few college classes at a time while you are working to ensure you are prepared for job promotions.
