career Interest Inventory Scoring

Count the number of likes for each interest area (it is color coded to make it easy). The highest amount of likes in one area is that student's interest area. It is possible to have two or more interest areas.

Investigative- They like science and math, are good problem solvers, and like working with ideas. They're thinkers and are curious about how things work.

Artistic- They like to do creative activities like music, dance, art, crafts and creative writing. They are expressive, original and independent.

Social- They like to help others, this may be through teaching, training, or curing them. They are good at communicating and listening to others.

Enterprising- They like to lead others and are good at persuading others to their point. They are ambitious, energetic and like to sell things/ideas.

Conventional- They like to work with numbers and follow a set orderly plan. They prefer to have procedures that are followed and have good organizational skills.

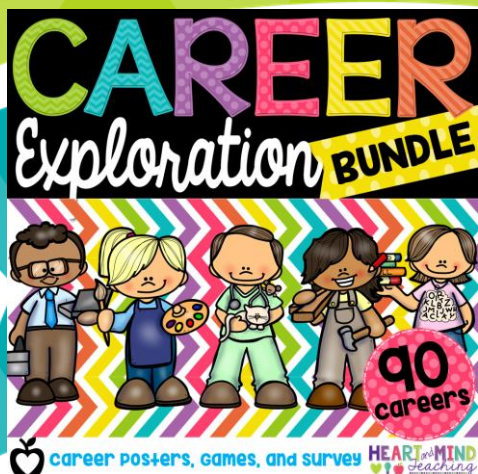
